





Service Launched on June 16th, 2018



PURPOSE:

Provide a safe, reliable, convenient alternative to automobile travel from Enfield to Hartford, New Haven, and Springfield and to other cities, such as New York and Boston, via rail connections

Other Benefits:

- Increase frequency of non-automobile travel options to Hartford, New Haven, and Springfield
- Reduce vehicle dependency and emissions






Main Street Existing Bridge






Main Street Proposed Bridge




Existing Circulation




Proposed Circulation


Division of Rights-of-Way

- Function: Acquire all property/property rights necessary for the project.
- Relevant Law
 - State of Connecticut
 - C.G.S. Section 13a-73 & 13b-36
 - Federal
 - Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Properties Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, as amended.



ROW – Acquisition Process

- Letter of Intent to Acquire
- Valuation
- Offer of Just Compensation
- Negotiation
- Acquisition
 - Agreement
 - Eminent
 Domain/Condemnation
 - 6-month appeal period





What is the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)?

- NEPA is a federal law that requires federal agencies to consider the environmental, social and economic impacts of their actions, including funding.
- Grants from three federal agencies are aiding CT DOT in complying with NEPA for the project.







Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) is the lead federal agency




The Benefits of NEPA

- Ensure effects to the natural and human environment are considered by federal decision makers (FRA, FTA and HUD).
- Sharing information with and involving the public in the decision-making process.
- Identify opportunities to avoid or minimize impacts.





The NEPA Process



This is a "Tiered" NEPA Process

- Tier I: NHHS "Programmatic" Environmental Assessment (2012)
 - Purpose and need (justification) for the overall NHHS program
 - Evaluated alternatives for individual projects
 - Evaluated overall impacts of NHHS program
- Tier II: Site Specific NEPA for Individual Projects
 - Detailed analysis of environmental impacts
 - Ways to avoid, minimize or mitigate impacts

NEPA Roles & Responsibilities: FRA, FTA & HUD

- Responsible for NEPA compliance:
 - Have all reasonable alternatives been considered?
 - What type of analysis is required?
 - Is there sufficient opportunity for public participation?
 - Is mitigation required for impacts?
- Oversees and approves the analysis and documentation
- Each agency makes a final funding decision





NEPA Roles & Responsibilities: CTDOT

- Proposed the Enfield Station project
- Provides planning, design and other information needed
- Conducts the NEPA analysis under FRA's guidance
- Manages the consulting team that provides technical and logistical assistance to:
 - Analyze impacts
 - Prepare documents
 - Conduct public outreach





NEPA Roles & Responsibilities:

Local Officials/Political Leaders, State and Federal Environmental Agencies, and the Public (You)

Before the analysis starts, comment on:

- Impacts that should be studied
- Alternatives to achieve the purpose and need that have not been studied

Issues raised will be studied if they are within the scope of NEPA.

Review and comment on the analysis conducted in the Environmental Assessment:

- Accuracy of information and assumptions
- Adequacy of methodology
- New information relevant to the analysis

Substantive comments on the EA will be addressed.
